





One of the best defensive backs around in the Class of 2024 is Withrow High School's Terhyon Nichols, a top high school football recruit, who had numerous collegiate offers before committing to play at the University of Kentucky.

Terhyon entered his senior season having wrapped up a highly decorated junior campaign when he registered 59 tackles (46 of them solo tackles) and three forced fumbles, helping Withrow to a CMAC Red championship with a 5-0 undefeated record in league play. He was named first-team all-CMAC, first-team all-city Div. II (Enquirer), first-team all-Southwest Ohio District and first-team all-Ohio in Div. II. He was a finalist for Cincinnati Sports Awards' Defensive Player of the Year, and was selected to participate in the Under Armour Next Football Camp series in Columbus. He was a second-team all-CMAC selection as a sophomore.

In this, his senior season, he had a memorable moment in a game vs. St. Xavier when he took the opening kickoff of the second half and ran it back 96 yards for a touchdown! He also had four tackles in the game. Through the first six games, Terhyon has 25 tackles, three interceptions and a fumble recovery.

A CMAC scholar-athlete, Terhyon also plays basketball and runs track for the Tigers. His junior year, he set a school record in the 100 dash. He was CMAC champion in the 100 and finished fourth in the region in that event. He was named first-team all-conference in track & field.

His favorite athlete is Ahmad "Sauce" Gardner, favorite entertainer and most-like-to-meet is Oliver Davis the 3rd, favorite book is Public School Hero and favorite movie is Jumper.
