A four-year varsity starter in baseball, center fielder Logan Castleman was a preseason All-American and all-state selection. He is a leader in the Commonwealth of Kentucky with a batting average hovering around .700. He helped the Tigers win the 9th Region All-A championship and the Kentucky state All-A title for the second straight year. He was named MVP of both the regional and state All-A tournaments.

His junior year, Logan helped lead the Tigers to its fourth Kentucky All-A state title and was named to the all-tournament team. On the year, he hit .433 with 32 RBI, 40 runs scored and 28 stolen bases.

He earned numerous honors, including being named 1st team all-NKY (Enquirer), a NKAC Div. II all-star and third team all-state. He plays for the Cincinnati Baseball Club during the summer and will play baseball collegiately at Wright State University.

Also an outstanding two-way starter in football, Logan helped lead the Tigers to a 12-2 record and a third straight Class 1A Kentucky state championship his senior year. On the season, he rushed for 1,702 yards and 32 total touchdowns. In his varsity career, he accounted for 3,308 total yards and 64 total TDs, plus had 12 interceptions on defense.

His many senior football honors included being named the Enquirer's Northern Kentucky Small School Player of the Year, NKAC's Div. II Player of the Year and 2nd team All-USA Kentucky by USA Today.
