







In tennis, Brooke last season helped Indian Hill win the CHL championship for the 26th league title in a row, plus the girls won the Ohio Div. II team championship. Brooke finished third at state in doubles with partner Lillian Dwyer and they were named by the Enquirer as Cincinnati Div. II Doubles Team of the Year. She finished with a 13-1 record in singles and a 4-0 record in doubles. She was CHL Player of the Year and SWO District Player of the Year. In addition, she was a finalist for Cincinnati Player of the Year by the Cincinnati High School Sports Awards.

In basketball, Brooke this season helped her team win a CHL co-championship. She averaged about nine points-three rebounds a game, with double-digit scoring efforts vs. Finneytown (23 points), Reading (19 points), Naples High School (18 points), and St. John Neumann (13 points.)She was second-team all-CHL. Her junior year, Brooke averaged 11.9 points a game, to go along with 2.4 rebounds a game. She earned second-team all-CHL, first-team all-district and honorable mention all-city Div. II honors by the Enquirer.

"Brooke is a fearless competitor," says her varsity basketball coach, Rachael Smith. "She is respected by her peers for her competitive edge, can-do attitude and leadership. Her ability to be an elite-level multisport student-athlete is a testament to her hard work and dedication on the tennis court and basketball court and in the classroom."

A great student who is very active in community service, Brooke will continue her tennis play next year at Butler University. In her spare time, she enjoys spending time with family and friends and volunteering for various organizations that help at-risk children.
